The Power of Words

Kinky Boots is an uplifting story of the inherent power of self-acceptance and the bravery it takes to be yourself. Throughout this production, we watch as the characters face rejection from family and colleagues and experience harsh words as they navigate unlikely friendships to discover the power of love and acceptance.

Some of the words that these characters use were more acceptable in our society when *Kinky Boots* was written. As we continue to strive toward a more inclusive world, it is crucial that we acknowledge the power of these words and how our vocabulary has shifted.

As you witness the action on stage, we encourage you to ponder: how have you reacted in the past when you have been confronted with a word that you found offensive? Would you have reacted differently than our characters in *Kinky Boots*?

Theatre has the power to open our minds and increase our empathy - by learning more about the impact of our words and how others feel, we can enrich our theatre experience as well as our own lives.

A Brief Glossary

Transvestite - sometimes used to describe a person who dresses in clothes primarily associated with the opposite sex, this term is used in this production but is now considered to be outdated and is not used to describe a person that identifies as gender-fluid or transgender.

Cross-dresser - a cross-dresser is a person who dresses in clothing typically worn by members of a different gender, sometimes (but not always) as a tool for gender expression.

Drag queen - this term differs from transvestite as it is typically used to describe a man who dresses "as a woman" for the purposes of entertainment.

Transgender - an umbrella term for people whose gender is different from their gender assigned at birth.

Gender - Gender can refer not only to the assigned gender of birth but also an internal sense of being a man or woman, or another type that does not fit either category.

Sexual orientation - Sexual orientation refers to an enduring pattern of emotional, romantic, and/or sexual attractions to men, women, or other gender identities. People of any gender expression or identity can be of any sexuality or sexual orientation.

Gender fluid - this term refers to a person whose gender identity (the gender they identify with most) is not fixed.

"Fags" - in this production, this term is used as a British slang word for cigarettes.

Unlikely Pairings

How much time do you spend with those who are different from you? I mean – REALLY different? To be honest, I don't spend enough time with them. I always intend to seek out people who are different from me, to see what I can learn from them. But it's so much easier to fall back on habit, to make plans with friends and family – it's just so much more comfortable, isn't it, to be with people who are like us?

And yet, every time I've reached out to someone who doesn't look or act or believe as I do, I have been rewarded. I may have been uncomfortable, it may have been awkward, but I learned and I grew, and I never regretted it.

In Kinky Boots, we see one such unlikely pairing of two very different people: Charlie and Lola. Charlie is stuck with a failing shoe factory he inherited from his father, while wanting nothing more than to enjoy his new life in London. But his meeting with Lola - a very different sort of person indeed - changes him. Despite some inevitable setbacks, these two human beings seemingly worlds apart - come together for a common cause, and they succeed. Unfortunately, other characters in the story aren't as open to new people and experiences. They judge Lola, based on appearances and on their own worldview, without allowing themselves to see the

person inside. But in the end, they too learn to accept people for who they are. Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could all be more open to "unlikely pairings" like Charlie and Lola? If we could look beneath the surface and beyond our own experience to walk in someone else's shoes – even in their "kinky boots" - for a while?

In our world today – even in parts of our own country – there are attempts to legislate against and even criminalize human differences; we seem to be growing less tolerant, not more so. In some places, those who, like Lola, don't fit what has been seen as "the norm", are taught to feel ashamed of who they are, and to hide their authentic selves in order to survive. As is all too clear from news reports, this intolerance can and does lead to violence – violence against those who are seen as different, and self-harm by those who don't feel accepted.

Kinky Boots offers a hopeful story about the power of embracing difference and seeking out those who are not like us. I hope you'll join me in celebrating our differences through this wonderful musical journey.


