A NOTE FROM LYNNE COLLINS

DIRECTOR

If you haven't seen the 2007 film, Waitress, on which Waitress - The Musical is based, do yourself a favor and watch it. As one review put it, "Sweet, smart, and quirky, Waitress hits the right, bittersweet notes in this romantic comedy with a witty script and a superb performance by Keri Russell."

The story of its writer, director and co-star, Adrienne Shelly, is even more bittersweet. After struggling to find her way in the film industry where women's voices were rare. Shelly had finally made the film of her dreams. Waitress had many parallels with Shelly's own life. Like her main character, Jenna, she was a new mother, an artist and a dreamer. Sadly, another horrible parallel occurred when Shelly, like Jenna, became the victim of violence. At the age of forty, she was murdered by a man who was robbing her office. Before her death, Shelly was able to celebrate Waitress's acceptance to the Sundance Film Festival. Sadly, she didn't get to experience the film's great success, the Tony-nominated Broadway musical it became, or the life of her 2-year-old daughter.

After her death, her husband established the Adrienne Shelly Foundation, a nonprofit organization which supports women filmmakers through scholarships, production grants, finishing funds, and living stipends. As part of its annual awards, the Women Film Critics Circle gives the Adrienne Shelly Award to the film that "most passionately opposes violence against women."

Along with the joy of presenting a wonderful musical filled with brilliant music, this production also celebrates the talent of Adrienne Shelly - and the groundbreaking work of many talented women whom she inspired. From the all-women team who created Waitress, to the women in the musical working at the diner, to our all-women creative team bringing the show to the Arvada Center, the message is so relevant. When women support women, "everything changes."

The show played on Broadway for four years and moved to the West End in London, Sara and Jessie went on to create the show Little Voice which they Executive Produced with JJ Abrams for Apple TV. Jessie wrote, directed and produced Corrina, Corrina and I Am Sam starring Sean Penn, who received an Academy Award nomination for his performance. Among her other directing credits are Curb Your Enthusiasm and Love the Coopers with Diane Keaton. She has been the Artistic Director of the Sundance Screen Writers Lab.

SARA BAREILLES (Music and Lyrics) achieved critical praise in 2007 with her No. 1 hit "Love Song." Since then, Sara has received seven Grammy® nominations, and one Album of the Year nomination. Sara composed the music and lyrics for Waitress, for which she received her first Tony Award® nomination. She also made her Broadway acting debut in 2017 by stepping into the lead role in Waitress. 2018 was a big year for Sara, she co-hosted the Tony Awards®, was nominated for an Emmy® and Grammy® for her role in Jesus Christ Superstar Live in Concert and was awarded with the Songwriters Hall of Fame's Hal David Starlight Award.


