Lunch Bunch and Extended Day Sessions for Busy Parents

Arvada Center summer camps have extended their offerings to include activities perfect for children aged 5–14 of working parents. Most of our camps run from 9:00AM–Noon and 1:00–4:00PM, but students may also sign up for a Lunch Bunch session from 12:00–1:00PM (children bring their own

Ballet I/Fairytale Camp

FOR AGES 6-8

This popular camp is created for young dancers with less than two years of training who are excited about dancing, learning and playing make-believe. This camp includes daily ballet class where students practice skills they already know and learn new material. Time is devoted each day to reading about or watching a few minutes of famous fairy tale ballets, and then learning to tell part of that story through pantomime and dance. In addition to telling the story, young ballerinas learn a simplified version of a fairy or princess solo dances.

This camp is geared for young thespians who want to learn what it feels like to dance in a Broadway musical. This camp is for students with less than two years of formal dance training. The week includes a Broadway style jazz class warm up, learning the lyrics and steps to Broadway production dances and video analysis of great musical theatre performances. Dancers also learn audition skills, and use video analysis to critique their own performance, as well as choreograph a musical theatre combination of their own.

ARTSTART DANCE

Our ArtStart Dance classes explore basic dance positions and steps through instructor led games, music and make believe. Additionally, children learn class room cooperation and etiquette which prepares them for more structured dance classes as well as how to be spatially aware and safe.

Attire: Depending on the dance discipline they are taking, children should wear:

- Tight-fitting clothing to view your posture and alignment.
- A leotard and tights with a dance skirt or a form fitting t-shirt with athletic shorts or leggings.
- All children should have ballet, jazz, tap, or hip hop shoes depending on the discipline they are taking.
- Shrugs, legwarmers, and sweater layers are acceptable.
- Long hair should be pulled into a ponytail or bun.

Creative Movement

FOR AGES 3-4

Through exercises and games that teach basic dance movements, children explore rhythm, develop gross motor skills and explore how their bodies can move. While pretending to be animals or shapes, they learn how to gallop, walk on their toes, melt, swing and jump. This class prepares children for more structured dance steps later. Students must be potty-trained and have reached their third birthday.

Arvada Center Summer Camps 2025 FAQs

Q: How do I register?

A: You can register with a credit card online at arvadacenter.org, over the phone at 720-898-7200, in person at our box office, or by mail. Registration forms are available in our catalog and online. Please ensure that the email address you provide when you register is one that you check regularly. If you are registering online, please be sure to include your child's name in the "Notes" field at check out to ensure that the camps you purchase are assigned to your child rather than your household

Q: What are the Arvada Center's registration policies?

A: Age Range: All Arvada Center summer camps are designed for specific age ranges. Please only register children that are within two months of the listed age range.

Refunds/Transfers: All requests for refunds or transfers must be made no less than seven days before the camp start date and are subject to a \$5 service charge. No refunds or transfers will be made after camps begin.

Deposits/Tuition Payments: Most camps require full tuition payment upon registration. A few camps allow a non-refundable deposit to hold a space for a child. Please see individual camp descriptions for payment details, including the due date for final tuition payment.

Q: Are there any required forms that need to be filled out for my child to attend camp?

All parents/guardians will need to fill out an electronic Participant and Medical Authorization (PIMA) form for each child attending camp no later than drop off than the first day of camp. There are several ways to access this form: it is linked in online camp registration receipts, it will be emailed out with camp FAQs before camps begin, and it is available on our website at the following link: arvadacenter.org/education/summercamps

Q: Does the Arvada Center offer care options for all-day campers?

Yes. The Arvada Center is offering several full day, multi-week Awesome Art Packs. Please see pages 3-4 for more information. Families that would like to build their own full day options for their campers may use the chart on pages 14-15 to see which morning and afternoon camps are scheduled each week. For families needing supervised care for their camper during the 12:00-1:00 hour, a Lunch Bunch session must be purchased. We also offer After Care supervised care after camps from 4:00-5:00 pm. Parents should register children ages 5-14 for each week-long Lunch Bunch and/or After Camp session at the same time they register for summer camps. Preregistration and pre-payment is required for each Lunch Bunch and After Camp session. No drop-ins or single day registrations allowed, but families needing coverage for less than a full week are encouraged to sign up for the whole week.

Q: Does the Arvada Center provide lunch or snacks for summer camps?

A: No. In order to provide a safe and inclusive environment for campers with food allergies and/or dietary restrictions, the Arvada Center does not provide snacks or lunches for campers. Campers registered for Lunch Bunch must bring their own non-perishable sack lunch and drink each day. Campers do not have access to a refrigerator or microwave. Campers are discouraged from bringing any foods with nuts in their snacks and lunch. All campers should bring a water bottle for use throughout the day and a healthy snack for each camp they attend. Water bottles may be filled at our touchless water stations. Water fountains may not be available. Except in cases of inclement weather, snack breaks will be held outdoors.

Q: How do I drop off and pick up my child for summer camps?

A: Parents are responsible for their child's safe and timely arrival and departure. On the first day of your child's camp, parents/guardians must take their camper to the assigned studio location to check in with the camp instructor before leaving the building. The Arvada Center requires all children age 12 and under to be escorted to and from studios and signed in and out of camps each day by a parent or other caregiver. Parents have the option of waiving the sign in and out requirements for their child by signing an authorization form no later than drop off on the first day of camp. Please Note: Any children not picked up within 10 minutes after a camp ends, will be supervised and charged a daily fee of \$20 per child.

Q: What if my child has allergies, medical conditions or other special needs?

Be sure to fill out all relevant information on our Participant Information and Medical Care Authorization form and discuss any concerns with the camp instructor. For students needing additional accommodations, the Arvada Center will provide classroom support at no additional cost for up to two weeks of camp (half days). If additional accommodations will be needed, please call 720-898-7241 in advance of the camper's first day of camp. If a child is injured, first aid will be administered, and 911 will be called in an emergency.

Q: Where do I go to view the summer camp art exhibition and when do I need to pick up my child's artwork that is on display?

Throughout the summer, artwork from the Center's visual art camps will be on display in the history museum. Artwork is on display one week at a time and new artwork is installed on Friday of each week. Artwork from the previous week's camps should be picked up no later than the following Thursday. Artwork not picked up within a week may be kept for a short time as storage space allows. Please call 720-898-7245 to retrieve artwork left for more than one week. All remaining artwork will

become property of the Arvada Center and may be disposed of at the end of the summer. The Arvada Center is not responsible for any misplaced summer camp artwork.

Q: How do I find out about performances in drama and music camps?

A: Weeklong drama and music camps typically present an informal showcase in the camp's studio location in the last half hour of camp. For detailed information about camp performances, please check in with your child's camp instructor or call 720-898-7245 or the Arvada Center Box Office at 720-898-7200. For specific information regarding weekend performances in multi-week drama camps, please check out pages 10-11 of our summer camp catalog.

Q: What should my child wear to summer camp?

A: We recommend that students wear comfortable clothes like shorts, t-shirts and sneakers. Some camps such as dance camps have a dress code and many visual arts camps recommend wearing old clothes and bringing a paint shirt. Please read individual camp descriptions carefully for required dress code information. Please label any removable clothing (jackets, sweaters, hats, etc.) with your child's name. During camp, please check studios for lost items. At the end of each week, all lost and found items left in the studios are moved to the Box Office and any items not claimed by the end of summer are donated to a local charity. The Arvada Center is not responsible for any misplaced items.

Q: What if my child is sick or is unable to attend camp for another reason?

A: Any camper who is sick should stay home. If your child will miss camp due to illness, a phone call to 720-898-7241, is appreciated, but not required. Unfortunately, we cannot offer refunds for any missed days or make up projects your child may miss. If your child is unable to attend camp because they have COVID-19 we will make exceptions to this policy. All campers are expected to be respectful of each other, camp staff, and Arvada Center equipment and facilities. The Arvada Center will not issue refunds for a child dismissed from a program because aof unacceptable behavior.

Q: If I have questions or if I need to get a message to camp staff or my child, who should I call?

A: For general questions and to register for camps, please call our box office at 720-898-7200. The box office can also relay messages to camp staff or your child. For more specific information, please call 720-898-7245 or 720-898-7241.




